



Understanding ISO22000:2005

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ISO 22000 states that an organisation requires the documents necessary to ensure the effective development, implementation and updating of the food safety management system.

There are specific references in the standard where it prescribes that the food safety management system will need to have documents. The following is a list of the documents required:

1. Food Safety Policy
2. Food Safety Objectives
3. Identification and Control of Outsourced Processes
4. Document control
5. Record control
6. Documents that specify how prerequisite programme activities are managed



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The extent of documentation will differ from one organization to another depending on the size and complexity of the operation and the competence of personnel.

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ISO 22000 section 4 outlines a number of general requirements, which one of these is not included:

- There must be communication of appropriate information throughout the food chain regarding safety issues
- There must be communication of information regarding development, implementation and updating of the food safety management system throughout the organization
- The FSQMS must incorporate the most recent information on the food safety hazards subject to control
- The FSQMS must have a Food Safety Team Leader who manages a food safety team
- Control of outsourced processes must be identified and documented within the food safety management system
